School is open from 8.45am

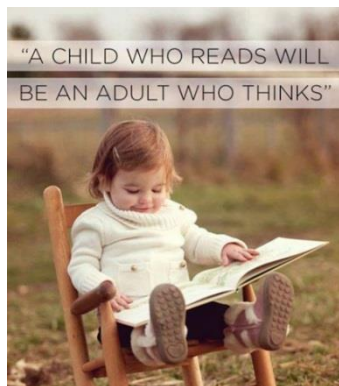
The first part of the morning is an important time for children to settle in class ready for their first lesson at 9.05am.
